

Thursday 19 March

PRE-CONFERENCE WORKSHOPS - 8.00AM TO 5.00PM

You nailed it! Presentation & media skills workshop (\$700 member/ \$800 non-member)

We all admire and envy those who can deliver a great presentation! This interactive workshop, delivered by actor team Imogene and Christoph Hewett from Resonant Integrity, will introduce skills and techniques to help you create and deliver impactful and inspiring presentations, whether to your work team or an audience of 100. It includes a course manual and use of practice equipment, as well as case discussion.
