8.00pm – 9.00pm	<b>Presentation – Development of medical standards for Phebra workers</b> Dr Sarah Moss will provide a presentation regarding the development of medical standards for Phebra workers.  There will be time after the presentation for AFOEM Trainees and Fellows to complete their DOFS paperwork.

## Important information about the tour

- Visitors will heading into a cleanroom environment and will be provided with hairnets, beard covers, overjackets and shoe covers to wear during the tour. Flat, closed toe shoes are required, no high heels please. It is preferable to wear clothing that keep legs covered, and also no powder-based make-up can be worn.
- Walking between the levels within the facility is mainly via stairs, plus there is a lot of walking around the facility.
- Places are limited due to the nature of the facility. If there is high demand, we may run the visit again later in the year.
- AFOEM Trainees will have the opportunity to complete a DOFS assessment with AFOEM Fellows during the visit.
- AFOEM Fellows who complete a DOFS assessment with a Trainee can claim Category 2 CPD points for this activity.
